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A letter from our President...

2020 was a year of many challenges for UCP-LI. Like many Long Islanders we locked down, stayed home and stayed safe. Our priority during this very difficult time remained the same as it has been for the past 70 years: the safety and well being of the adults and children with disabilities entrusted to our care.

Throughout the pandemic, UCP provided the high levels of exceptional care we always provide to keep the individuals we serve safe. Our heroic team delivered outstanding comfort and care. This was especially clear in our Residential Program. While onsite services at The Children's Center and in the Adult Day Programs were suspended; supports continued remotely. In our 31 houses our Residential Program remained operational caring for 225+ vulnerable individuals who sheltered in place.

Direct Care staff enforced new protocols, donned masks, gowns and worked countless hours of overtime. Their commitment was unwavering.. At a time when families were sheltering together, our families too sheltered together, providing the highest level of care in the most difficult of times. I saw first hand the many sacrifices made by staff to ensure those in our care were well cared for.

UCP-LI celebrates 70 years, it certainly was not the celebratory year we had planned. But the health and safety of our individuals and staff; our constituency; and the heroic efforts of our team gave us much to celebrate. Thank you for continuing to support us in our mission to create a LIFE WITHOUT LIMITS. We were in this together and we continue to remain thankful to all of our supporters!

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Adult Day Services



Brushstrokes Program

The Brushstrokes Program gives participants an opportunity to create intriguing pieces of artwork that reflect their dynamic personalities. The program consists of more than 20 artists who paint each day. Their work has been displayed in community art exhibits and at UCP of Long Island Special Events.



Day Treatment

This program is certified to provide 125 adults over 21 years of age with training and assists with the continuance of basic independent living skills through activities, such as exercise, pet therapy, art and music, social and recreation events, and appropriate community integration activities.



Day Habilitation

Enhances the ability of participants to pursue an inclusive lifestyle by providing and promoting opportunities to become more involved, productive and interactive within the community. Our *Independent Living* and *Program Without Walls* programs provide individuals with a variety of community-based experiences such as computer training, adaptive exercise, healthy food choice preparation, sensory activities, music enrichment, and self advocacy. Our individuals learn how to safely navigate our communities; integrating volunteerism as a part of their daily experiences.



Employment Connection

The Employment Connection of UCP of Long Island provides employment-related services leading to competitive community employment for people with disabilities.

The Children's Center

UCP of Long Island Children's Center is committed to creating a *Life Without Limits* in the lives of children with disabilities through an educational partnership joining home, school and the community. The Children's Center, located in Commack, has provided over 37 years of excellence in educational services including preschool, school-age programs and early intervention services tailored to meet the physical, cognitive and emotional needs of children with disabilities from birth to 21 years of age.

Residents regularly enjoy taking part in community outings and events. Like all Long Islander's, UCP of Long Island is preparing to "un-pause". Our priority during this difficult time remains the same as it's been for past 70 years: the safety and well-being of the adults and children with disabilities we serve. Throughout the pandemic, UCP provided the high levels of **exceptional care we always provide** to keep the individuals we serve safe. This crisis required many new procedures and protocols to be implemented for the protection of individuals and staff. And through it all, our heroic team delivered outstanding care and comfort.

This was especially clear in our Residential Program. On-site services at the Children's Center and the Adult Day Programs were suspended; and supports offered remotely. But the 31 homes in our Residential Program remained operational and 225+ vulnerable individuals *sheltered in place*. Direct care staff enforced new protocols, checked temperatures, donned masks and gloves, and worked hours of overtime. Their commitment was as always, unwavering. Perhaps hardest of all was the "no visitation" rule: parents and loved ones were unable to visit.

At a time when families sheltered together, UCP families *trusted* our direct care staff to keep their loved one safe. UCP's staff provided the highest levels of care during the most difficult of times. Inside our homes, to help alleviate fear, sadness and to manage stress, staff provided programs via Zoom, kept individuals socializing with their friends and loved ones, encouraged outdoor activities (including gardening), and so much more. ***They are our heroes.***

Outside our homes, you will see freshly painted birdhouses hanging in trees, newly arranged colorful rock gardens, or "rainbows" in the windows – for those out seeking. ***More evidence that heroes work here...***

UCP has always been grateful for our extended family. This includes YOU. Yet this time has been challenging...staff overtime, personal protective equipment and similar vital expenses have skyrocketed. These costs arrive at a time when our fundraising events have been postponed. Our need for your donations is great. Please take a moment and send your donation today.





2020 REVENUE & SUPPORT \$49,636,100




2020 TOTAL EXPENDITURES \$49,526,900




